Dear friends and colleagues,



The Scientific programme of the 22nd European Congress of Pathology will consist of daily Keynote Lectures on recent scientific and diagnostic advances, Symposia covering selected areas of pathology, Short Courses addressing new scientific results, practical diagnostic challenges and methodological problems, Slide Seminars on actual problems of diagnostic pathology, Videomicroscopy Tutorial Sessions (interactive case discussion with experts), and a special Plenary Session on the "The many faces of the cancer cell: a pageantry of morphological appearances and their biological significance".

Main topics include:

- **Breast Pathology:** novel variants of intraepithelial neoplasia, intratumoural heterogeneity, diagnostic utility of gene expression profiling, personalised treatment in breast cancer
- **Cytopathology:** endosonography guided FNA, cytopathology of the cervix, pitfalls on FNA, cytological/histological approach and ancillary techniques in lung and pleural tumors
- **Dermatopathology:** diagnosis of spitzoid lesions and medico-legal issues, molecular biology of melanocytic lesions, update on adnexal and vascular tumours, pitfalls in dermatopathology
- **Electron Microscopy:** role in infectious disease pathology, current diagnostic applications in surgical pathology, pitfalls in tumour pathology solved by EM
- **Endocrine Pathology:** poorly differentiated endocrine carcinomas, morphology vs. molecular biology in malignant endocrine neoplasia, unusual/difficult diagnoses in routine pathology, update in genetics of GI endocrine tumours
- **Digestive Diseases Pathology:** role of pathologist in targeted therapy, gastrointestinal biopsy reporting and other diagnostic challenges in GI pathology
- **Gynecology Pathology:** consultant experience of 25 years: "The mistake(s) I made", controversial topics in tumour pathology
- **Head and Neck Pathology:** controversial issues in head and neck pathology
- **Information Technology in Pathology (Computational Pathology):** virtual slides in tissue based diagnosis, telepathology, web-based continuous medical education, teleteaching
- **Nephropathology:** renal involvement in systemic autoimmune diseases, new insights into the pathogenesis of renal diseases, diagnostic challenges in nephropathology
- **Pediatric and Foeto-Placental Pathology:** pediatric tumours, selected perinatal issues
- **Pulmonary Pathology:** problematic issues in pulmonary pathology, combined diagnostic approach to lung cancer, occupational and environmental lung diseases, pleural diseases
- **Soft Tissue Tumors:** recent advances in bone and soft tissue pathology
- **Uropathology:** from pathogenesis to prevention and therapy of prostate cancer, the impact of different histological subtypes on the therapy of kidney cancer, from aetiology to prevention of bladder cancer, unusual/difficult diagnoses in uropathology
- **Cardiovascular pathology:** sudden cardiac death with apparently normal hearts, selected topics on heart and vessels surgical pathology, anatomical exhibition on how-to study hearts from sudden cardiac death
- **Haematopathology:** new WHO classification of lymphomas, microenvironment and lymphomagenesis
- **Miscellaneous topics:** unusual/difficult diagnoses in liver and pancreas pathology, pitfalls in neuropathology, history of pathology, teaching in pathology, paleopathology, humoral rejection in solid organ transplantation, Langerhans cell histiocytosis, the contribute of pathologist to stem-cell medicine advance
